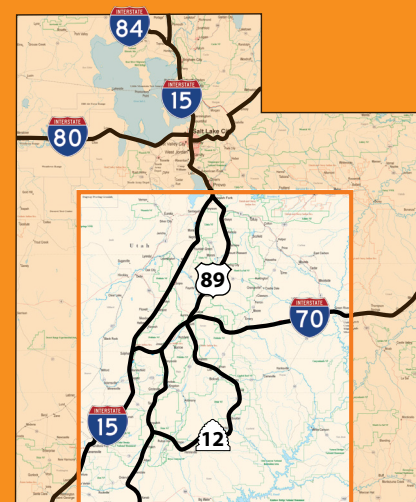
State Parks

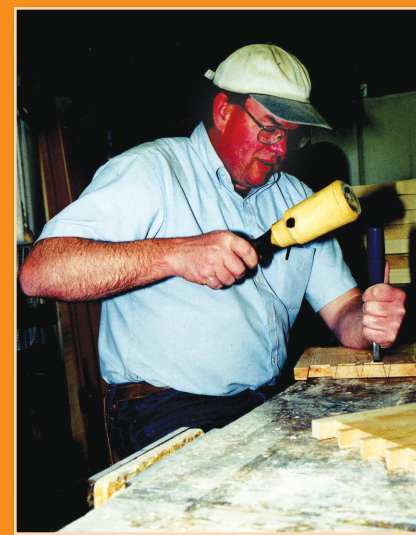
